# **Steering Committee Nominee Application for 2017-2019**

The Alamo Regional Data Alliance (ARDA) is seeking 2017-2019 Steering Committee nominations for <u>up to three</u> <u>positions in the Local Government and Utilities sector</u>.

# Who can I nominate? What should I consider before nominating?

Due to the commitment required, it is not recommended that you nominate anyone other than yourself. At this time, the Steering Committee has vacancies only in the Local Government and Utility category as defined below.

#### Are there eligibility requirements?

Yes, there are 4 basic requirements to serve on the Steering Committee that each nominee should meet:

- The nominee should be at least 18 years old and live in one of the following counties: Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, Medina, McMullen, or Wilson.
- The nominee must be a member of ARDA prior to nomination. Membership is free to join.
- The nominee must be currently employed by <u>local government and utilities</u> for which the seat is designated to represent (see table).
- Each nominee must sign a *Steering Committee Commitment Form* at the time of nomination.

This form along with an optional short biographical sketch should be completed and submitted to <u>Courtney.Denton@uth.tmc.edu</u> during the nomination period. The current vacancies will be filled by the majority vote of the remaining Steering Committee members, after a public announcement of the vacancy and call for selfnomination open to anyone eligible for that seat, with the self-nomination period closing 15 calendar days after the public announcement.

The current deadline for nominations is Friday November 24, 2017.
